


YOUR QUICK GUIDE TO MISSION DAY CAPE TOWN



VENUE INFORMATION

- Group photo outside the Two Oceans Aquarium at 10:00 am
- Check-in after the event, held inside the Aquarium between 16:00 pm and 18:00 pm.
- Note that all screenshots need to be submitted by 17:00 pm and a minimum of 6 MD branded missions need to be completed in order to qualify for the Niantic badge. Information on how to submit your stats will be available at check-in on the day. If you can not make check-in, speak to your POC
- The Aquarium will stay open exclusively for Mission Day attendees between 17:00 and 18:00. There is no compulsory entry fee - but please make a donation to the Turtle Project via the Mission Day Website as there are costs involved in support of a very worthy cause.



WHAT TO EXPECT

- There are 24 missions. In order to qualify for the scanner badge, you'll have to complete a minimum of 6. Which ones you do are your choice. There are several points of interest throughout the City, and we hope the missions give you a good taste of what Cape Town has to offer.
- You'll get good signal in the City and suburbs. If you are planning to travel further afield (for example, Simonstown and Cape Point), the signal can get spotty. Check coverage with your provider.



ROUTE INFORMATION

- Missions go live shortly after midnight on Mission Day, Sunday 23 September, and will stay online thereafter. Only missions completed on the 23 September 2018 and checked-in before the cut-off at 17H00 on the day will contribute towards the badge.
- Most of the missions are within the City Centre and Waterfront area. There are some that are a bit of a walk from the City Centre and Waterfront area. Hail an Uber or hope on the MyCiti Bus if your feet are not up to it (there may even be a local Agent willing to take you to those ones).
- There are 6 missions which are out of the CBD area and generally require a car. These are in culturally, historically or aesthetically significant areas of the City. We guarantee the trips will be worth the effort.
- The MD missions were designed for daytime, quality, safe, play, so doing them at night is at your own risk and not recommended.
- Cape Town is well-known for its nightlife, but like any big city, it can be dangerous at night, especially if you are walking alone with visible valuables (like your scanner). So please be careful, and take someone with you if you chose to start at midnight.



PLEASE NOTE

- Allow ample time for traffic and parking during your visit.
- The Sanlam Cape Town Marathon is being held on the morning of the same day (Sunday 23 September) and as Monday 24 September is Heritage Day, this is a long weekend and there will be an influx of visitors to Cape Town.
